Last year, through UMCOR relief, over 30,000 of these kits were distributed from the Midwest Mission Distribution Center. They went "just around the corner" and also nationally and internationally. Due to the agency's buying power, they are able to supply these kits valued at \$14 for only a third of the price.

Dear friends at Salem UMC,

I thought it could be helpful to share some information about me before I meet you in person. I was born and grew up in Italy, and I am 5th generation Methodist. (No, not all Italians are Catholic!) My great-great-grandfather founded the first Methodist Church in Italy. Both my father and grandfather were Methodist ministers.

I received my calling to ministry as a teenager during a powerful worship service in a youth church camp. During my twenty-seven years of pastoral work, I have experienced moments of deep discouragement and uncertainty, but I have never doubted that God called me to ordained ministry. His Spirit never left my side throughout all the highs and lows of my years of service.

I graduated from the theological seminary in Italy. I was also blessed with the opportunity to study at the McCormick seminary in Chicago where I received a Master in theology. In 1996, I married a Wisconsinite and pastor, John Hobbins. After our ordinations, we served congregations in Italy and had our first child, Giovanni. Giovanni is a creative designer, lives in Atlanta, and just became engaged.

In 1993, we moved to Madison so that John could go back to school. I never thought I would be a pastor again, but God surprised me with a renewed calling, first to youth ministry, and then to full time ministry at Bethany UMC in Madison. During that time, our second child was born, Elisabetta, who just graduated from Johns Hopkins. She will start medical school in a year and is taking a gap year to serve with a non-profit called Medical Missionaries in Haiti.

In 1999, I received a calling to a new church start in Waunakee at Crossroads UMC. It was a wonderful, uplifting, and exhausting experience. After building the actual church building with so many committed and amazing people, I got the biggest surprise of all: a new baby girl. Anna is going to be a freshman at Waukesha West High School in Waukesha this Fall!!

After Crossroads, I was called to the Family Church, another new church start, where I served for the past 12 years. I have been blessed in creating a ministry for families with many gifted and faithful people.

Now a new chapter begins, and I can't wait to see what God has in the store for us. I look forward to meeting all of you very soon, and discovering your passions and your vision for Salem UMC.

Treasurer's CORNER


Treasurers Corner
