

A note from Pastor Paola

As I am writing this first note for the Tidings, I am still at my mother's house in Italy. The time here, apart from taking care of some family business, has been a precious time to slow down, rest, and relax. I needed to distance my mind and soul from my last ministry and prepare for the new future God is calling me to enter among all of you at Salem.

During this time in Italy, my daughter Anna and I spent a week with my brother Luca and his family in Tuscany. Now, you need to know my brother and I love each other very much, but we have a very different way to conceive a vacation. I am more like "lying-down-on-a-comfortable-chair-under-a-umbrella-by-the-sea-surrounded-by-all-commodities-and-Wi-Fi" kind of gal. He is more like "let's-go-everyday-on-a-crazy-and-new-adventure-as-far-as-possible-from-civilization" kind of guy. Of course the vast majority of the group went along with the cool, fun, and adventurous uncle rather than going along with me, the boring aunt. So... on we went, one adventure after another.

One day we went to a protected wildlife park along kilometers of sandy beach. We rode a bus to a point and then walked for a couple miles to the

beach: no umbrella, no cars, no chairs, no stores, no toilets, no Wi-Fi...nothing, only a bare beach. We looked for fragments of trees to build a makeshift tent to hold up our beach towels and protect ourselves from the sun.

After that I jumped into the sea to get a break from the heat, and as I was alone in the most crystalline water I have ever swam in, I felt a profound sense of peace, joy, and harmony that I haven't experienced in a very long time. I truly felt one with God and His creation. In that bare, beautiful place I was just a loved child of God without false pretenses of control and power.

Then, it occurred to me: This is what the Sabbath is all about. Sabbath is the day of the Lord. It is the day when we stop, resign our control and give back our lives to God. On Sabbath we truly rest and are replenished because God takes care of us, we are completely in His loving hands. This is why the observance of the Sabbath is among the commandments: When we forget to observe it we are left empty, exhausted, and broken. It took my crazy adventurous brother to remind me to take time to observe the Sabbath Day and remember to be replenished by the Source of my life.

Salem's Operating expenses for June, including shingling the garage, were just over \$13,500. Income was

\$14,200. For July, expenses are projected to be \$20,000+. We will resume the expenses of a permanent pastor including housing, pension, and health insurance. We also have some transition overlap expense from Pastor Bill. July also includes a quarterly payment for the multi-peril building insurance and repairs to the lawn mowers. Income for the first three weeks in July was \$11,000+, leaving \$9,000 still needed. In a cost saving move, we have changed from twice a month to a once a month payroll, thus saving on processing fees.

Hope Center Meal


