The woman had tears in her eyes as she explained that she was helping her daughter and 4 grandchildren whom were now displaced. The four boys darted out of the house with joy in their voices and laughter in their step. The volunteers didn't have to lift anything because before they knew it the boys had moved all the beds inside.

We share this story because we want you to know that whatever the situation or whomever is in need, Hope Center is here to "Be The Hope". We don't need to know their exact situation or all the messy details, just that we were needed.
