A note from Pastor Paola

“Later, I will give my Spirit to everyone. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your old men will have dreams, and your young men will see visions. In those days I will even give my Spirit to my servants, both men and women. I will work wonder in the sky above and on the earth below.” Joel 2:28-30

As I am writing this note, we just finished plowing the snow from this weekend and are getting ready for more snow tomorrow. I just lived through my 24th winter in Wisconsin (Yes, I count my winters just like someone would count their big life undertakings!), but this year it feels as though winter is not going to quit.

Yet, May is here. We must have faith that spring is coming, and with spring comes renewal, new beginnings, and new life.

In the life of the church, this is the season of Pentecost, the day when the Christian community was born. The Spirit brought renewal, new beginnings, and new dreams.

On Sunday, April 8, members of Salem voted on the offer for purchase of the vacant lot north of our church building. The ballot count was as follows: YES-50, NO-2, and 1 person abstained. Thank you for your presence and for your vote. We are very excited, and pray that the next steps go smoothly.

The following is an update from Salem's Land Use Committee:

We have entered a period of time called "Due Diligence", during which the Buyer will be conducting environmental/soil testing on the site and will be working with representatives of the City of Waukesha on land planning, zoning issues, permits, etc. The "Due Diligence" period may last until early August. If everything proceeds according to schedule, the real estate closing should occur before the end of the year.

Outreach Ingathering: personal dignity kits

The Ingathering is a way that United Methodists support people who are in need. Our Wisconsin Conference of the United Methodist Church collects for this cause every year at the June annual conference. This year we are again seeking monetary donations to help provide Personal Dignity Kits valued at \$14 each. With the buying power of the Midwest Missions Distribution Center, south of Springfield, IL, they can purchase the items for the kits at about one-third of that amount. The Personal Dignity Kit is the number one kit requested at the distribution center. Last year 36,456 kits were sent all over the Midwest and internationally to help people maintain basic hygiene. The kits include: shampoo, bar soap, deodorant, bath hand towel, washcloth, comb, nail clippers, toothbrush, toothpaste, and razor. We will be collecting monetary donations only through June 3.
