You may have already heard that John Wesley opened every small group meeting asking people to consider this question: "How is it with your soul?"





It refers to when Jesus, in the Upper Room during the Last Supper, said to his disciples: "A new commandment I give you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another." 7:00 pm Tenebrae




The word "tenebrae" comes from the Latin meaning "darkness." The Tenebrae is an ancient Christian Good Friday service that makes use of gradually diminishing light through the extinguishing of candles to symbolize the events of that week from the triumphant Palm Sunday entry through Jesus' burial. This increasing darkness symbolizes the approaching darkness of Jesus' death and of hopelessness in the world without God. The service concludes in darkness and silence, with a final candle, the Christ candle, carried out of the sanctuary, symbolizing the death of Jesus. The service will include our choir and other special music.


Once again, Salem has shown great generosity reaching out to God's children in another part of the world. Thank you Salem, one and all!

2019 General Conference United Methodists Seeking a Way Forward



On February 23-26 in St. Louis there will be a special session of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church. The purpose will be to receive and act on a report from the 32-member *Commission on a Way Forward*. This Commission was authorized by General Conference in 2016 and appointed by the Council of Bishops to examine paragraphs in *The Book of Discipline* concerning human sexuality and exploring options to strengthen the unity of the church.

In the United Methodist Church, we have different opinions about human sexuality. This is a very painful and personal issue not matter where we stand on it. During the 2016 conference the United Methodist Church came close to a schism because of it.

This is a critical time for our church as it is and has been for many other denominations. It could lead to a deep crises or to an opportunity to find a New Way Forward to be ONE in Christ speaking the truth in love. Prayers are highly needed as well as a great deal of hope.

Our own Michelle Lacock will be at this special session in St. Louis. She will be sending us updates during each day. We are planning to forward her emails to you.

On March 6, our Bishop with the cabinet and the conference leadership will be meeting to process the results of General Conference and to prepare a plan of action in whatever way might be needed for the Wisconsin Annual Conference.

On March 30, mostly likely there will be a South East District Conference from 9 am to Noon on the results of General Conference and the following steps of action for our district.

Pastor Paola is asking for prayers for our church and General Conference during this crucial time.
