The Lonely Ember

A church member, who previously had been attending services regularly, stopped going to church. He had told some friends from the church that could communicate with God just as easily out in nature as his setting for worship.

After awhile, the pastor decided to visit him for a friendly visit. It was a chilly evening, and the pastor found the man at home sitting before a blazing fire in his fireplace.

Guessing the reason for his pastor's visit, the man welcomed him, led him to a big chair near the fireplace and waited. The pastor made himself comfortable but said nothing. In the grave silence, he contemplated the play of the flames around the burning logs.

After some minutes, the pastor took the fire tongs, carefully picked up a brightly burning ember and placed it to one side of the hearth all alone. Then he sat back in his chair, still silent. The host watched all this in quiet fascination.

As the two watched in silence, the coal ceased burning, turning ashen gray, while the other coals in the fire continued to burn brightly. Not a word had been spoken since the initial greeting.

Just before the pastor was ready to leave, he picked up the cold, dead ember and placed it back in the middle of the fire. Immediately it began to glow once more with the light and warmth of the burning coals around it.

The pastor's silent message was not lost on the parishioner. After a long pause, he turned to the pastor and said, "Thank you so much for your visit and especially for the fiery sermon. I shall be back in church next Sunday."



Did you know??

In 1950, Bob Stuempfig was one of six young people in the confirmation class.

In 1953, Salem had 28 baptisms. including Heidi Jean Ehlke (Wes & June Ehlke's daughter).

In 1964, among many others, activities included the Jr. Choir having a picnic at Frame Park and the Young Couples going bowling. There was an All Church Picnic at Nagawaukee Park.

Salem Evangelical United Brethren (former name of Salem United Methodist) purchased 11.4 acres at our present site and built this church building in 1965-66 at a cost of \$307,750 (included the land, improvements, parking lot, organ, furnishings, insurance, and architectural fees).

On Sept. 10, 1966, Bob & Bonnie Stuempfig were married at Salem (the 3rd couple to be married in the new church).

In 1967, sixty new members joined Salem.

In 1968, Marie Annette Reichert (Broege) was baptized, and Gary Wollenzien's parents (Harold and Fern) were new members.

From 1979 to 1987, Gloria Rongstad was our church secretary.

On Dec. 20, 1981, the Rev. Galen Luebke baptized Brenda, Jennifer, and Laurie Hauenstine (Buxengard).

In the spring of 1980, Salem's Men's Club was organized. Their meetings began with suppers prepared by the UMW circles. Officers for 1980-82 included Dick Mueller as V.P. and John Klopp as treasurer.

On August 24, 1985, the Rev. J. Wesley Corbin married Douglas Frank Lindsay & Brenda Louise Young at Salem.
