Did you know that.... Since the 30 Hour Famine started in 1992, the total number of kids under age 5 who die each day — (most of them

from preventable causes like hunger, poverty, and disease) — has fallen from 40,000 to just under 19,000. That is amazing! Praise God!!

Your donation to the Food Pantry of Waukesha County directly helps Waukesha County residents in need. Salem donations have an immediate and lasting effect on our community. THANK YOU!

- The Food Pantry serves an average of 1,300 clients each week.
- Over 5,800 of clients are children.
- 300 loaves of bread, 250 cans of fruit, and 100 boxes of cereal are distributed at each of the 7 sessions each week.
- Registered clients can come to the Pantry once every 14 days and they receive about 3 days worth of groceries.

- 1. Canned Peaches (fruit)
- 2. Canned Protein (stews)
- 3. Cereal (if you like it, clients will too)
- 4. Mac and Cheese
- 5. Cream and Chunky Soups
