Match Day: Another Big Success!

Thousands in southeastern Wisconsin generously donated to the Greater Milwaukee Foundation's 4th Annual Match Day. Match Day is a 24-hour online giving event organized by the Greater Milwaukee Foundation. On March 19, \$3,490,522 was raised to support 20 area food and shelter agencies! It is called "Match Day" because a pool of \$845,000 was available to match online contributions proportionately, based on the total amount raised by each organization.

Here is what our Waukesha organizations raised:

- Waukesha County Food Pantry: \$134,805.00
- Hope Center: \$81,505.00
- The Women's Center: \$183,463.00
- Hebron House: \$72,701.00

(These donations will be matched proportionately.)

Palm Sunday Bake Sale Results

The Palm Sunday Bake Sale was very successful! Thank you to the bakers, the buyers, and those behind the scenes, who helped set up the tables and clean up! \$626.00 was raised from the bake sale and \$136.00 was raised from selling "peeps" and chicks, for a grand total of \$762.00. 
Church Picnic! Sunday, May 17th following Praisefest

Spiritual Growth Ministry Team

At our April meeting, the Spiritual Growth Ministry Team wrote together a prayer for our Salem family and friends. Over the next few months, we will each take time to intentionally pray this prayer, confident in knowing that God hears us when we pray for others (intercessory prayer).

This prayer is based on Colossians 1:9-10, which is in Paul's letter to the church at Colossae in AD 60-61. Paul wanted to develop personal connections with the people he hoped to teach and serve. In the same manner as Paul prayed for the people of Colossae, here is what we will be praying our Salem family and friends:

"We will pray for you and ask that you are filled with the knowledge of God's will in everything you do. We pray that you lead your life so that, in all things, you are motivated by the love that Jesus taught us. We pray that you continue to learn about God and nurture your relationship with God by studying scripture and by sharing God's love with others."

Aldersgate Day

Perhaps you've heard of Aldersgate Day, but don't know what it means? It is a day that is celebrated by Methodists on May 24th to commemorate the day in 1738 when John Wesley "experienced the confirmation of his salvation by the grace of God" in a meeting room on Aldersgate Street, London.

According to his journal, Wesley found that his enthusiastic gospel message had been rejected by his Anglican brothers. Heavy-hearted, he reluctantly went to an evening society meeting on Aldersgate Street. It was there, while someone was reading from Martin Luther's 'Preface to the Epistle to the Romans', that he felt that his heart was "strangely warmed." He describes it as:

I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death.

It took him some time to learn how to live the life of faith, for he was not always possessed of joy and thought he had fallen from salvation. It took time for him to see that it is not Christ and good works, but Christ alone who saves, resulting in good works. As time went on, John Wesley was mightily used by the Lord to reform England. He rode on horseback, as many as 20,000 miles a year, telling the gospel to all who would listen.



On Pentecost Sunday, May 24, we will be pleased to welcome a special guest to Salem UMC, Professor Genilma Boehler. The Rev. Dr. Genilma Boehler, a native

of Brazil, is a missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church. She teaches in the School of Theological Sciences at the Latin American Biblical University in San Jose, Costa Rica. She also has responsibilities in the area of pastoral and lay education.

Genilma lives with her two sons, Guillermo and Arturo, ages 20 & 17. They came to Costa Rica with her to join her on her missionary journey. She feels very blessed to be accompanied by these two young men.



Dr. Boehler is an ordained elder in the Methodist Church of Brazil

and has worked with indigenous people, street people in a large urban area, and also in Christian education and collegiate ministry. She has taught anthropology, philosophy, religious culture, and theology, and she has conducted specific projects dealing with gender issues and human rights.

"I have lived in great poverty and am part of a migrant family," Genilma says. (Her call to ministry came at age 17.)

"As years passed, I learned that God has a special love for the poor and suffering of this world. God feels a special love for the marginalized because God through Jesus has known our pain, our wishes, and our hopes. This is why I believe in God's love."
