
V.I.P. Harvest Brunch Sunday, Oct. 5 11:30 AM

- Tutoring students to develop their reading, math and writing skills.
- Through the Pen Pal program, volunteers work from home, exchanging letters with students.
 Through the course of the year, students develop writing skills and the dialog provided benefits both students and seniors.
