
SALEM DARTBALL

We are excited to announce a new Adult Bible Study Class for church school this fall! This Bible-based, Christfocused, United Methodist-approved curriculum is used by over 400,000 students and teachers each week.

Hope Center is a non-profit organization that has been serving the basic needs of food, clothing, furniture, and financial assistance in Waukesha County for more than twenty years.

"Project Move" Volunteers Needed

There is a constant need for appliances, furniture, and other household items for people that are relocating from a shelter or a family residence. They need basic items for the next step into independence and self-reliance. Homelessness sometimes is not about a roof over one's head so much as it can be about having a bed instead of an air mattress, a refrigerator instead of an ice chest, or a sofa instead of a lawn chair.

Kitchen Goods Needed

Hope Center is in need of kitchen items for their clients. They have a shortage of the following items: Coffee pots, toasters, crock pots, flatware, and utensils. Please make sure they are clean and in good repair.

Clothing Needed

Through June 2014 Hope Center has given away over 5,300 pieces of underwear and over 7,200 pairs of socks! That should give you an idea of the demand they have for the most **basic items** in their Clothing Shop.

Not because good music is provided, though I obtain much benefit from that part of the service; Not because other people go, though following the crowd is alright when the crowd is going the right way:


Not because I'm afraid God will punish me if I am absent, though neglect of church attendance brings spiritual poverty;
