# Children & Teen SUNDAY SCHOOL

We are so excited about

starting a new Sunday School year! We will gather in Fellowship Hall following Children's Time in worship every Sunday except the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the month when we ask our children to stay in worship and experience Holy Communion with their families.

Youth will meet for Sunday School on the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays of the month. (Confirmation Class will be on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the month from 10:30 to 12:30).

We have a new curriculum for our youth! "Real Conversations" will include entertaining DVD clips and will help our Christian teenagers live authentic lives and will give them tools to reach out to their friends in ways that won't give them cold sweats! Students will discover the secret to sharing the reason for the hope that's within them.

Here is the September teaching plan for our children:

**Sept. 9:** Our younger children will be learning about The Good Samaritan. Our teens will begin their new study with "Opening Doors to Real Conversations". Following Sunday School, all preschoolers through 12<sup>th</sup> graders will enjoy our annual pancake breakfast! Confirmation Class starts at 10:30 AM.

**Sept. 16:** Our children learn about story of the Fiery Furnace. Three very faithful men are thrown into a fiery furnace because of their allegiance to God. Will they survive? Come and find out!

**Sept. 23:** We will learn about the story of Elijah and the Dead Boy. Come and hear about this miraculous story! Our teens will continue their new study with "The People You Encounter Day to Day".

**Sept. 30:** This Sunday School lesson brings to life one of the most well-known prayers in all of history. The disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray, and Jesus responds with some of the most beautiful verses in all Scripture. We'll learn why prayer is so important.

## Tales from the Trustees

We are pleased to announce that we are moving ahead with two important projects. We have hired a local contractor to remove

asbestos in the following areas:

- 1) The floor tile and mastic in the back hallway
- 2)The carpeting and mastic in the youth room
- 3)The exposed pipe insulation in the small janitor's closet near the east end of the building.

This work is scheduled to begin on Monday, Sept. 10. The Fellowship Hall and all the areas east of it will be off limits for about one week.

We have also hired a local contractor to furnish and install a horizontal, motorized, remotely-controlled, adjustable roller shade to cover the large skylight in the Sanctuary when needed. If everything goes as planned, the installation should be completed by early November. This shade will eliminate the problem of glare and sun wash-out on our PowerPoint screen which greatly affects our worship experience. We apologize for the inconvenience we about to experience. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

In the next week or so, a few of the Trustees will meet with the City of Waukesha Fire Marshal to clarify some issues before ordering and installing the new entry doors. There are several questions that we need answered before we can proceed.

Betty Henderson served on the Northcott board. Salem's Church Council has committed \$1,000 to this ministry with funding coming from specific designated memorial funds, existing VIM (Volunteers in Mission) funds, and an individual commitment. Northcott is a key part of the Rainbow Covenant and a priority conference project.

### Change is Coming for the United Methodist Church

In 1972, the present language about human sexuality was added to the United Methodist Church's Book of Discipline. Increasing harm to one another and a deepening impasse related to human sexuality and the unity of the church has led to a Special Session of the General Conference in February 2019 in St. Louis.

A special commission was formed following authorization by General Conference 2016. This is called the "Commission on a Way Forward", and they have identified three possible options, or plans, for our denomination as we move into the future. The Council of Bishops has recommended adoption of the *One Church Plan*.

From Bishop Hee-Soo Jung: "The Council of Bishops is committed to a future for the whole United Methodist Church. We are fully aware of the emotional magnitude and spiritual distress many in our Church experience over the LGBTQ+ concerns, and yet we truly believe that we can stay united even beyond our disagreements of the authority of scripture and its interpretation. In no way is our recommendation for the *One Church Plan* discounting the importance of our varied perspectives, but we are attempting to establish a "grace margin" in which all believing Christians can co-exist, even WITH our different readings and interpretations.

The Wisconsin Delegation to the General Conference is hosting nine educational and listening sessions around the state to allow feedback about the proposals. These sessions for interested clergy and laity will each last between 60-90 minutes. The most convenient location for us is at Waukesha First UMC, on Tuesday, October 23, at 7:00 PM.

The purpose of all this information gathering is for the Delegation to hear from the diversity of membership that makes up Wisconsin United Methodism. The desire is to better understand the thinking and feeling within our Annual Conference membership about our denomination's future. All are welcome to participate!

# The Ripple Effect

By definition, "ripple effect," is the continuing and spreading results of an event or action. One may wonder, what does this have to do with Salem? With Salem's ongoing support, we have made a difference in our community and the world. Here are some examples:

 Donating to Pie for Paul... the money was used to supply tilapia for their ponds, residents were able to farm the tilapia and use the proceeds to support their families. (continued next column)

- Lasagna War...\$1800 was raised to support the malnutrition program in Haiti. Basic nutritional education leads to the health and well-being of families.
- Undie Sunday... a donation of socks or underwear helps Hope Center clients use their limited resources for other needed items.
- Christmas Clearing Council... providing a gift to a child helps the parents use their limited funds to perhaps stock their pantry, not to mention spread the joy and wonderment of Christmas to a child.
- Ingathering financial support for Personal Dignity kits... 3,694 pounds of kits (from participating Wisconsin Methodist Churches) were sent to Florida for hurricane readiness.

This fall you can make a difference and become a "Ripple Maker" as Outreach turns it focus to the Waukesha Food Pantry! The pantry is extremely low on personal care items. Basic items such as a toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, deodorant, etc. can help! A ripple from such a donation, can turn into personal cleanliness and dignity... which in turn, could lead to...
