In many ways this is what is happening at Salem. The sale on March 4th of the north lot of our property, the funds coming from the sale, the exciting ministry opportunities opening with our new neighbor New Prospective Senior Living, the new attention our facility will receive...are truly giving us a sense of excitement for the future. It is time of visioning and dreaming for old and young. It is time to pray a lot and pay attention to God's voice leading us through this new journey. It is also time to carefully listen to each other with love and respect, because God is working through each of us so that many ideas will help us to form our vision. As you may know, Salem leadership started the dreaming process with a retreat. A mission statement team has been formed. Our church council will receive the results from all of this work and soon begin forming a plan for the next few years.

I would like to share some of the clear leading ideas that emerged from the retreat:

• Improved visibility and update of our building. We realize we need to become more visible. Our facility needs updates and remodeling. It has been my experience (through 4 church building programs) that a remodeling project has the potential to bring excitement and attract new people. It will be the work, prayer and visioning of a building committee to bring a proposal to the entire congregation for changes, discussion and a final vote.

- Another major leading idea will be the expanded collaboration with New Perspective already began through the process of the sale. The synergy between Salem and New Perspective will be bringing great opportunity for service and ministry for both of us. We are also looking forward to a growth in our ministry toward older adults (within and outside of Salem).
- The final leading idea that emerged from the leadership retreat is the creation of a new staff part time position for family, youth, & children. Thanks to Bill Pardoe and all those who have been devoting their time and energy, this ministry has a solid base ready to grow and reach out to more youth and children in our community. The millennials are starting to have children, and they are searching for churches to support them in providing spiritual guidance for their kids. A stronger family ministry will also be involved in our community social reality poverty and homelessness among families with children had a dramatic increase in last few years.

And this is only the beginning. Keep on dreaming Salem....the best is yet to come!

The word "tenebrae"



comes from the Latin meaning "darkness." The Tenebrae is an ancient Christian Good Friday service that makes use of gradually diminishing light through the extinguishing of candles to symbolize the events of that week from the triumphant Palm Sunday entry through Jesus' burial. This increasing darkness symbolizes the approaching darkness of Jesus' death and of hopelessness in the world without God. The service concludes in darkness and silence, with a final candle, the Christ candle, carried out of the sanctuary, symbolizing the death of Jesus. The service will include our choir and other special music.



Our new missionary, at Mujila Falls

in Zambia, Africa, along with advice from our former missionary, Paul Webster, has sent the following message to us:

I thank Salem for continually supporting Mujila Falls! Paul (Webster) and I had been wishing for a small dormitory that can house, say 20 men and 20 women. I roughly estimate the building will cost between \$4,000 to \$8,000. We hold training programs with the Peace Corps and each time about 30 counterparts are crammed into our living room and the volunteers camp in a barn or just outside in the open. It is my belief that once decent accommodations are available, more women and more trainees funded by institutions will be coming to learn at our center. Peace and Blessings!

From the Trustees

In March, our focus has been on basic maintenance of the Church. A corner guard was installed near the church office to prevent further chipping of the drywall. The drinking

fountain (aka bubbler) supply line in the back of the church was capped. The drinking fountain was continually running. The Trustees decided to remove the fountain completely since it was almost impossible to get to the shut off valve. The toilet in the Women's restroom was repaired. The clocks were changed from CST to daylight saving time on March 9th.

Another ongoing project is dealing with the 3 electrical panels in the church. A team has been tracing the electrical circuits and compiling a "map" to identify the outlets and switches for the entire building. This is a slow and time consuming process.

There are many more projects that are now on hold until the weather improves. Look for more updates next month.
