
# A Note from Pastor Paola...

# **Building Team Report**

At the October meeting, we reviewed the comments of Steve Knudson from VJS, a design, build, construction service. He had done a quick walk through of the church and made some note-worthy observations. With his comments in mind as well as the list of our church needs necessary for our ministry, we are now going to look at the original building plans identifying where new space can be created and old space can be used more efficiently. In order to do this, we will be going through the building section by section. At our next meeting, we will focus on the sanctuary in terms of what changes or updates may be needed.

The Committee also discussed in depth the type, placement, and location of a new outdoor electronic sign. There are still a few more questions that need to be answered before we can proceed. When we make our final decision, the project will be presented to the congregation for their approval. Installation will not and cannot be done until Spring however.

#### Tales from the Trustees

Everyday maintenance and planning continues with priority on the replacement of the front doors. We expect two more proposals to come in next week. The trustees cleaned out the

garage and moved the last of spare roof tiles to the north side of church. New sensors for water leaks, pipes freezing, and heating failures have been installed and connected to monitors at the offices of our insurance carrier.

We have agreed to continue to allow many of the workers who are constructing the building for New Perspective Senior Living to park in our parking lot. Iconica, the Contractor, will pay for all of the plowing & salting in our parking lot **on weekdays**. We will pay for all of the plowing/salting in our parking lot **on weekends**.

New Perspective Senior Living is finalizing plans for the "green space" which they are going to develop on the south side of their building. The "green space" will include a swing/play set, bocce ball, planters, a fire pit and patio. We will have access to this space via a sidewalk (at our expense) which will connect to a new entrance on the north side of our building.
