


Salem United Methodist Church Growing Together on the Journey with Christ

I was actually supposed to be visiting my son and daughter in law right now. We already had a party planned with all their friends with an immense quantity of pasta.

During the last few weeks, I have been cancelling everything, all plans, all parties, all traveling all events in my personal life and at church, just like many of you. Truly, I have moments of great sadness, grief, and even anger. I also have times of great anxiety as my entire family lives in the red zone of the virus in Italy.

This COVID-19 has entered violently in our lives taking away all control from our hands.

Yet, in the midst of all of this, I have been experiencing moments of pure joy, comfort, and peace. Interesting enough, many of the things I usually do when I look for comfort I cannot to do now. But comfort and peace has been taking me by surprise in the most unexpected moments in the last couple of weeks.

In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, many of you have been asking how you can help! The Waukesha Food Pantry is in need of many items, especially during this time. In the last couple days, their daily number of clients has almost doubled! AND they are adding new clients every day.

The Waukesha Food Pantry has temporarily changed how they serve clients by switching to curbside service and giving items in prepackaged bags/boxes. HOWEVER, the shelves are getting lower every day. Much needed items include cereal, canned pasta, and chunky (meat) soups, canned fruits & vegetables, and shelf stable protein (tuna, chicken, and peanut butter).

The Outreach Team would like to make it easy for you to donate items. If you would like to donate food pantry items, please bring them to Salem. However, instead of our normal drop off location inside Salem, please place the items in the bin *inside the Bell Tower*! As you approach the east entry doors to the narthex, the bell tower can be found on your left. A sign is on the door at the base of the tower. We will pick up the items every few days and deliver directly to the food pantry.

Monetary donations are always appreciated in lieu of purchasing items to donate. To donate, make your check to Salem UMC with "Food Pantry" in the memo line, and mail the check to church. You can also make a donation on the Food Pantry's website. You may even want to consider setting up a monthly ongoing donation directly from your checking account to the Food Pantry!

Big News from Mujila Falls!

Our new missionary, Temba Nkomozepi, at Mujila Falls Agricultural Centre in Zambia Africa, along with advice from our former missionary, Paul Webster, has sent the following message to us:

I thank Salem for continually supporting Mujila Falls! Paul and I have been wishing for a small dormitory that can house, say 20 men and 20 women. I roughly estimate the building will cost between \$4,000 to \$8,000. We hold training programs with the Peace Corps, and each time about 30 counterparts are crammed into our living room, and the volunteers camp in a barn or just outside in the open. It is my belief that once decent accommodations are available, more women and more trainees funded by institutions will be coming to learn at our center.

Tales from the Trustees

A new **COLOR** copier has been ordered for the Salem office! After months of analyzing our needs and comparing functions and costs between three local copier companies, the trustees were presented with a proposal to buy a factory new machine that copies and prints color. We have decided that the church will buy our own toner as needed rather than subscribe to a dealer-supplied maintenance.

The narthex entry door replacement project is proceeding with doors now being fabricated by the manufacturer. Trustees expect installation next month. Timing of installation depends on delivery date and weather conditions. Security of our building will not be compromised during installation period.

Meanwhile, trustees have kept up with daily tasks to keep things humming:

- Reset clocks for Daylight Savings Time
- Monitor water usage to detect leaks
- Replace burned out bulbs in front sign
- Review proposals for lawn mowing
- Reset flood alarm sensors
- Arrange for tree removal in parking lot.

If you have a concern about maintenance of our physical facilities that the trustees might be able to fix, leave us a note in the "trustees" mail box.

Building Team Report

The Building Team voted to purchase new electronic signs for our church from Signs and Lines. The main sign will be

4 X 8 feet, with a reader board on one side with electronic messages that can be changed via the computer as needed. The other side of the sign will have a permanent message, name of Church, time of service, etc. Both sides will be backlit.

The second sign we are purchasing is an entrance sign that will be located near the present lamppost. The size of this sign is 42" x 54" and the name area will be 18" x 48". The size is dictated by the City of Waukesha. It will give the name and address of the Church. It will also be backlit, making it stand out at night. All masonry work for these signs will be done by a mason of our choice rather than Signs and Lines. This will save money.

The Building Team also voted to go with Ott Development as our contractor for the remodeling of Salem. According to the District Superintendent, "the team can sign a letter of intent as long as it didn't include a contract to proceed." He also said we could spend money to get preliminary drawings if necessary, however when we are ready to sign a contract with Ott Development, we will need to have a Church Conference to get the approval of the congregation. This has to be done in person.

Jeff Grahl from Ott Development and his architect, Brad Kropp from Perspective Design are willing to do an initial floor plan design and to walk through with various subcontractors in order to estimate costs for each area of our remodel AT NO EXPENSE TO US. This is very generous of them. It will give us a better idea as to what we can afford to do. We will look at all this new information at our next meeting.

Updating our Church Directory

We are working at updating our church directory. You should have received a copy via email so you can check to make sure all of your information is correct. This is more important than ever! Once everything is updated, Amy will send out the final directory and you can print it yourself if you'd like. Otherwise we will print several copies.

Hope Center Program Changes Due to COVID-19

Please keep the Hope Center and its volunteers in your prayers. Thank you, Salem.

The following is an email from Hope Center: To our guests, volunteers and donors:

We have been monitoring the COVID-19 situation and have had to make the difficult decision to suspend the majority of our programs starting Monday, March 16th. We plan to provide meals "to go" at our normal serving times, but we cannot allow guests to eat in the Day Center or congregate on the property after serving. We will not be operating at all on weekends. Our Clothing Shop will not be open, and we will not be accepting donations. We are asking volunteers to come in if they are comfortable, we still have plenty of work to do!

This is a difficult, but necessary decision. We understand the strain this will put on our guests. We do not have answers for many difficult questions they have. We unfortunately do not have a timeframe for when we will be open for full services. We will be working with the city and county to find out when we can reopen at full strength.


