"Love your neighbor" is Jesus' commandment for us. It is what defines us as Christians. Nevertheless, today in the age of social distancing, safe at home, necessary separation and isolation, things have changed dramatically. How can I love my neighbors if I don't see them, I cannot hug them, I cannot talk to them, I cannot hear about their troubles?

Who Is My COVID-19 Neighbor?

You may remember how Jesus answered when a teacher of the law asked him this question. He answered with a story... the story of the man hurt on the side of the road and neither the priest nor the teacher stop to help him. Only the Samaritan stops and helps the man. Jesus then asks, "Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

So that is our answer, it is all about **compassion**, **mercy**, **and "going and doing"**. It is about letting our heart be moved by someone else's suffering and to let that suffering inform our actions.

I know there are days in this pandemic when we get overwhelmed with so much suffering in the world, it paralyzes us. There are days when our own suffering disables us to a point that we cannot handle other people's suffering. Then of course, there are days when we would like to reach out, but we can't for safety reasons.

How do I love my neighbor in COVID-19 times?

- First, care for yourself: body, mind and soul. (Remember, "love your neighbor as <u>yourself</u>") We need to pray, eat well, exercise, laugh, talk with friends and loved ones, have a spiritual friend who loves us, speaks the truth to us without judgment, and holds us accountable.
- Pray for those neighbors who are suffering. Some days the list is very long. God will lead you in finding ways to love and care for them.
- Be part of collective ways to love our neighbors. Salem provides opportunities to give time, money, and talents during this time. Together we can make a bigger difference.
- Let your heart be moved by others' suffering and reach out directly. (Zoom, FaceTime, phone calls, cards, driving by, visiting from a distance, dropping off a little gift, help with grocery shopping, etc.) God uses compassion to move us to love, and God gives us lots of creativity to do it in new ways.
- Finally, remember that our neighbors are close and far, and loving them means to open our vision outside of the usual walls. At Salem, we will continue to reach out in love and mission as far as God calls us to, in our city, in our nation, and around the world.

And here is the best part... in loving our neighbor, in mission and generosity, we receive a gift. It is the gift of meaning, purpose, and calling. In giving, our soul finds healing.

This is a critical time!

The number of clients at the Food Pantry have almost doubled, while the number of volunteers has dropped (to be expected, as many volunteers are older and more susceptible to the virus).

Just a reminder that it is still easy for you to donate items to the Food Pantry. Just place the items in the bin *inside the Bell Tower at Salem*, to the left of the exterior entrance doors to the narthex. A sign is on the door at the base of the tower. The items will be picked up every few days and delivered directly to the food pantry.

Monetary donations are always appreciated in lieu of purchasing items to donate. Up until May 21, a local business will be matching community donations up to \$25,000! Please send your donation to Salem (payable to Salem UMC with "food pantry" in the memo line) as it will help fulfill our community obligations through Council.

The Food Pantry is also in need of sanitizing wipes and sprays. These are needed to sanitize the carts that go back and forth from the volunteers to the clients. If you have extra sanitizer items, please drop them off in the bin at Salem or drop off at the Food Pantry inside the donation door.

Building Team Report


The Building Team met last Tuesday, April 21, via Zoom with Jeff Grahl from Ott Development and Brad Kropp of Perspective Design to walk us through the rough plans developed and the estimated costs for our project. They did this at no

cost to us. After they left the meeting, the Committee looked at our finances and unanimously agreed that we should proceed with the remodel of our Church even though we are in the midst of the Covid-19 Pandemic. We will meet again via Zoom the end of April to go over the rough plans and make changes that we feel are necessary.

Progress on the electronic signs is moving along, but slowly. Permits are needed from the City of Waukesha, which takes time, and our mason needs to give us his cost for the foundation of these signs.

Rob Roszkowski has been working on changing the dangerous entrance to our Church and has already gotten permits to proceed. However, we need to work with New Perspectives to connect with their driveway before we can start improving our entrance from Hwy 59. Otherwise, we will have no access to the Church. This driveway, however, is dependent on their construction progress.

As you can see, we have several different things going on at the same time; so keep the Building Committee in your prayers as we proceed.

Food Pantry
