
This is why we need the physical building of the church: because when we gather together in Jesus’ name, anything is possible.

Continuing the Delay of Opening of our Church for Worship

We are looking into creating a task force that will prepare for the reopening. Until then the building will be available to Salem small groups meeting. We will not yet be available to outside groups.


Needed: Sunday School teachers!


Food Pantry Donations!

Bill Dossett, our mason, and Steve from Signs and Lines are working together to get Salem's new outdoor electronic sign installed. Diggers Hotline was here on JUNE 29th. The city permit is being applied for. Signs and Lines and the mason would like to have the new sign up and running by mid-July. However, the issuance of city permits have been slow in coming since the shut down due to Covid-19. Also, since we do not have the needed electrical power for the new sign, we will have to trench a new line out there. This can all affect the completion date for the signs installation.

By the time you receive this issue of the Tidings, we hope you have had a chance to view the Building Team's video presentation on the proposed changes for Salem. You should have all received an email with the plans and drawings. If you have any questions or ideas after viewing, please forward your emails to Kermit at kbohning1@gmail.com or call Bonnie Wojcik (262-751-1590) by July 3rd. If you had trouble viewing the video, please call the church office.

The video format was chosen because most people felt uncomfortable about meeting at Church in large groups due to the virus or because of personal health issues. The Team felt the video was the best way of getting Salem's renovation information to everyone at the same time.

These are preliminary drawings not the final plans for Salem. The ideas for the changes came from you through the summer Task Force presentations, Leadership Retreat, interviews of new and potential members, and the Summer Listening Sessions. In the church narthex, you are now able to view 3-D renderings of the these improvements.

As we move forward, continue to keep us in your prayers as we try to fulfill our mission statement of *Helping Salem Shine Christ's Light of Hope and Compassion Inviting All to Grow, Connect, and Serve.*
