Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

If I try to summarize the past 7 months, I would say they have been wounding.

No matter how you stand on Covid19, racial injustice, wildfires, the economy, and the presidential campaign, we all share pain and suffering, anger and frustrations, anxiety and discouragement. The way we deal with that is denial, aggression or defeat. But there is a different way... Jesus' way described in the prophetic words of Isaiah:

"The Messiah was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed" (53:5)

I can be wounded healer. I can be open and vulnerable about my wounds. I can show my pain, then lovingly and gently touch other people's pain with my words, my silence, my presence, my gift of love. It is called *compassion* (in the original Latin root means "co-suffering"). My suffering can bring healing to others, not because I have a special power, but because I let God's healing power work through me.

Can you imagine for a moment what would happen if we all use our wounds as a vehicle for God to bring his healing?

Wounded healers help others and themselves to find the way to hope out of suffering, because they know that when we travel through death's valley, we can trust that God remains with us.

Dear Salem family, it is our call to be wounded healers, and that allows us to live by hope, looking to what God is doing among us with courage, boldness and confidence.




Welcome all Salem women!

Food Pantry Update

Colder weather is fast approaching! We have moved our collection area to inside the narthex so that donated items don't freeze or spoil. **Starting October 1st,** all food donations left at our building **MUST BE BROUGHT INSIDE.** Here is what the collection area looks like:



Please note the following:

- NO fresh items. Those must be taken directly to the Pantry. They love your veggie garden extras!
- Any and all canned goods. Soups with meat are preferred.
- Diapers needed size 5 or 6, partial packages ok.
- Disinfectant wipes or sprays needed (every cart is wiped down before it comes back so volunteers can refill for next client).
- Cereals (oatmeal by the carton and/or instant packages) and kid cereals are very appreciated!
- Hand soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, shampoo, etc needed!
- Egg cartons (dozen size only) opened and stacked to conserve space would be appreciated.
- Grocery bags, both paper AND plastic are needed.
- Monetary donations are always welcome.
 Make your check out to Salem UMC, with note in the memo line: Food Pantry. Salem totals these donations, records them, and then sends a quarterly check to the Food Pantry.

Building Team Report

Since the passage of the preliminary vote on August 16, the Building Team has been working very hard. Recently, we received the 75% plans from our architect, Brad Kroop and our builder, Jeff Grahl. The week of September 21, members of the Building Committee checked these moredetailed plans for accuracy and made changes that were required. After we returned the 75% plans, the architect came and took final measurements in some areas of the Church. From this, he will be able to develop 95% plans that will be used to gather bids on our remodel. Once the bids are in, we will all know what the cost will be to update Salem. The Building Team is as anxious as you to find out what the cost will be, but we must be patient for a few more weeks.

Also, in the third week of September, members of the Building Team met again with Nick Rogneby from Metro Sound to identify and finalize what would be best in terms of audio and visual for our building. We will receive his report in a couple of weeks.
