

Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said: I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life. -John 8:12

This is what I need today, the light of life.

As we are approaching one year from the beginning of the pandemic, we look back and see so much darkness in our world and often in our hearts. It has been a long dark year.



Jesus makes a bold statement here: I am the light of the world, and if you follow me, you will never walk in darkness. Jesus didn't say admire me; he didn't invite us to join a church or a religion. He said follow me, and following Jesus simply means: I will do what he says.

So...

- When I have in front of me someone who has different opinions from mine, I will remember Jesus saying: "love your enemy".
- When I am feeling anger and revenge rising in my heart, I will remember Jesus words: "Blessed are the meek for they shall inherit the earth".
- When I am becoming arrogant, boastful and self-centered, I will remember that Jesus said: "If anyone wants to be first, he must be last of all and servant of all."
- When I see someone in need and I am tempted to look to the other side and walk away, I will remember Jesus' call: "Give, and it will be given to you."

"Follow me and you will never walk in darkness and you will have the light of life."

As Lent approaches this year I would like to invite you, for 40 days, to make a deliberate choice every morning to follow Jesus. I promise you, you will be surprised by the power of light entering in your life.

In worship during Lent, we will also follow Jesus step by step, from Galilee to Jerusalem, with messages from the miracles in the Gospel of John. We will study the Gospel of John in our Thursday Bible study, and we are extending an invitation to everyone to read this entire Gospel (see more information in the following pages).

Finally, we will have the opportunity on the first Sunday of Lent to follow Jesus by showing our love toward the babies in Haiti by supporting the malnutrition program at the St. Joseph Clinic in Thomassique.



Week 2 (Feb. 24 – March 2) John 2-5 The Signs


Week 3 (March 3-9) John 6-11 "I Am"

Week 6 (March 24-30) John 20-21 Eternal Life



Sharing our Love with Haiti

Soon Salem will have the opportunity to share our love for children in Haiti. On Sunday, February 21, we will have a live Zoom service to learn more about St. Joseph Clinic in

Thomassique, Haiti. We will be joined by Paola's daughter, Betta, who worked at this clinic for a year. The clinic serves Thomassique and its outlying villages of about 125,000 people. There are numerous programs under the auspices of the clinic, but the program we have focused on is called the Medika Mamba Child Malnutrition Program. Medika Mamba is a peanut butter-like nutritional supplement given to severely malnourished children. It restores 90% of these children to good health in a short amount of time!

Salem has committed to fund the \$2,700 yearly salary of Wilner, the Medika Mamba Program Coordinator, who will also be joining us for the live Zoom service on Feb. 21. You may mail a check to Salem marked for Haiti, donate using PayPal (a link will be available on our Facebook page), or bring a check or cash and drive through at Salem on Sunday the 21st from 10:30 – 11:30 AM. If you drive through, we will have freshly baked cookies to thank you for coming out! Hope to see many of you at the drive through!



The remodel and renovation of Salem is moving along as planned. According to the latest weekly construction schedule, the demolition work in the front part of the Church is completed with all the necessary doorways and windows filled in.

All the asbestos has been removed in the hallway, Fellowship Hall, Mary Jo's office, and Adult Classroom 1. This, as you know, was not was not part of the original plan, but we are happy that this safety issue is taken care of.

The framing-in of closets, the sound booth and new walls where necessary, is on-going. The main restrooms have been dry-walled as well as some areas in the sanctuary. The rough electrical is also being completed in these areas.

Roof penetration and duct work for air conditioning of our building is moving forward as planned, despite the wintery weather. The duct work for the HVAC will be visible on the roof over the Fellowship Hall. Since our Church has no basement or attic to hide this duct work, the roof was our only economical option. Our HVAC is a conventional forced air system. So expect to see HVAC duct work from ground level. We are in the process of discussing what can be done to improve the view.

Our new outdoor Church sign is now up and working. Messages can be placed and changed from a computer anywhere! We no longer have to go out and manually change our sign. © Next time you are driving by, be sure to take a look. Thanks to Kermit for taking the lead on this part of the project.

The Design Committee is continuing to meet as needed to make decisions for the interior of the Church. The Committee has selected paint colors, laminate tops for cabinets, restroom tile, door handles and continues to make many more

decisions as they arise. A big thanks to Laurie Buxengard, Amy Manns, Vicki Nease, and Gary Wollenzien for their time and expertise.

As in all remodels, there are always surprises and day to day decisions that need to be made almost immediately. Our Building Committee is filled with many able and capable members that have come together to meet these challenges. Perhaps, some of you have heard about the small leak over the altar in our temporary library chapel. Luckily, our Salem singers were there that evening to move the altar and put a bucket under to catch the dripping. A call was placed that very night to the construction company. The next day it was taken care of by our contractors with no real damage done. We continue to monitor the building process to the best of our abilities and thank all the members of Salem for their continued support and trust.

Salem Renewable Electricity Funding

Long-time Salem member, Betty Henderson, believed that part of our



Christian service involved protecting and caring for the world that God created for us. With her encouragement and support, Salem Church decided to purchase all our electricity from a renewable energy source. This was possible through WE Energies' relationship with Arcadia Power, a solar and wind farm company. Purchasing renewable electricity costs Salem an additional \$25 a month. Many members give donations to cover this cost so it does not need to be a budget expense. Unless we talk about it, we may forget that we made this commitment. Loving my neighbor: Mark 12:31 "Love your neighbor as yourself"

- Commit to praying for a family in your neighborhood.
- Write a note of encouragement to family, a friend, or neighbor.

Loving How God Made You: Zephaniah 3:17 "The Lord God is with you. The mighty one will save you. The Lord will be happy with you. You will rest in his love. He will sing and be joyful about you." Read 1 John 4:7-21 and/or 1 Corinthians 13:1-13 with your family.

Repeat the scripture and replace all the "you", with "I and Me".

Loving my enemies Matthew 5:44 "But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

Give a kind word or complement to someone you find challenging to be friends with.

Pray for those around the world who make poor decisions, and ask God to fill their hearts with love.

Loving My Friends and Family John 15:13 "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friend."

(Jesus Christ showed His love (agape), by sacrificing Himself on the cross for you and me to have eternal life.)

Give a Valentine Card to friend or family. (Handmade is best)

Help make a special Valentine family meal. Offer to do a chore for one of your siblings.

Loving God Deuteronomy 6:5 Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.


Try this at home: an activity that shows what happens when we let "GOD" in to our hearts. Blooming Hearts: Activity

First, you'll need the following supplies:

- construction paper or Thin paper is best
- scissors
- a shallow pan of water

Cut a bunch of hearts out of construction paper. You can use red, pink, and purple paper. The thinner the better.

Next, fold the hearts like so: *Pointy end up *Left and right wings down over the folded pointy end



Once the hearts have been folded, you're ready to experience "God's Love".

Drop the folded paper hearts into the pan of water.


