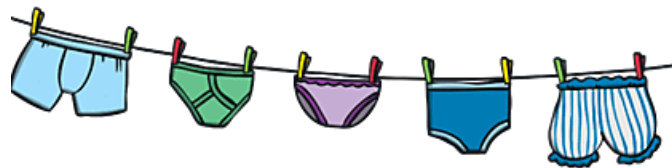

Friendly Phone Call Program

The Friendly Phone Call Program seeks to decrease social isolation and reduce the feelings of loneliness in our senior clients. Though guidelines are constantly changing regarding COVID-19, the Friendly Phone Call Program allows clients a safe and consistent way to socially engage with others from the comfort of their own homes. There are currently 70 clients in Milwaukee County and 50 clients in Waukesha County in need of a Friendly Phone Call volunteer.

Fall Yard Clean Up

This fall, we will need many volunteers to help local seniors and adults with disabilities prepare their yards for winter. Duties include: raking leaves, cleaning flower beds, pulling weeds, trimming bushes, cleaning gutters, storing lawn furniture, washing windows, etc. Right now, we are still following our COVID-19 procedures which includes wearing a mask at all times while serving, remaining at least 6 feet away from others, and limiting the group size to no more than 4 volunteers per home.

Holiday Card Decorating

Feeling crafty or in the holiday mood? We have more than 3,500 blank holiday cards in stock and are in need of creative decorators to make them festive for our older adult clients. Cards will come in bundles of 25. For a single person or a family, we suggest starting off with 25-50 cards at a time. For groups, we can give up to 100 cards at a time. Instructions with an example on how we would like the cards decorated are included with your bundle of cards.

Pick-ups and drop-offs will be available at our Waukesha offices Monday-Friday, 9 am to 4 pm. To help with social distancing, we have a table outside our office suites for you to pick up undecorated cards and return decorated cards.
