Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

Like most of you, I've been watching with sadness and anxiety the events taking place in Ukraine. Seeing Russian rockets fired on Ukraine, troops and tanks heading towards the main Ukraine cities, the many wounded, and the people fleeing is deeply disturbing. So far, 3.5 million people have left for neighboring countries, and another estimated 6.5 million people are thought to be displaced inside the country itself.

Some wars can be morally justified... when it is to prevent greater harm to others or to liberate others. This is not a war that can be justified. We see once again how the dark side of the human heart is led to violence by the desire for power, wealth, control, and revenge.

God is grieving in front of these images. God has been grieving for the violence humans inflict upon one another since the first violence in human history as a brother killed the other over uncontrollable hatred.


Violence is a demonstration of human corruption and will be part of our world until the end of times. God's heart will continue to be broken over and over every time we chose violence over love.

Sanctuary Easter Flowers


Orders due Sunday, April 10

Medika Mamba Fundraiser Final Report

Your generosity towards the Medika Mamba Fundraiser this year exceeded all expectations. We sent \$6250 to Thomassique, which included late donations from last year's fundraiser and \$500 allocated from the Outreach Budget. We met our goal of supporting Wilner's salary with a surplus of \$3325. Recently, the Clinic was also able to secure a new, very large Rotary grant for the Malnutrition Program, which will cover many of its needs and expand the program's scope. In light of all this amazing news, the Clinic staff and the Outreach Committee discussed the most cost effective use of our fundraiser's surplus funds this year. The joint decision was made to support the salary of a part-time nurse dedicated to the Malnutrition Program. This decision applies only to the coming year, but we are hopeful that our fundraiser will continue to be successful enough to maintain or increase our support and impact.
