The month of May is the Christian Home Month in the United Methodist church calendar; there is no better time of the year to be reminded how a family's love is the greatest source of joy in life.

Goodbye April, Hello MAY! May, more than any month of the year, wants to feel most alive. Let's hope Spring finally arrives.

The Trustees are looking at repairing the leaks in the old roof in the women's restroom and the family restroom in the back. Leaks occurs sometimes in Spring after the snow melts on the flat roof. Tiles need to be sealed or replaced. Dave Pauly is taking the lead on this project.

Two other members of the Trustees, Caryn Adair and Bonnie Wojcik are compiling a written inventory of the Church as well as a photo/video documentation for insurance purposes and in the event we need a replacement value on an item or items.

Recently, Rob Roszkowski and Bill Hauenstine met with the Complete Lawn Services which we employed for landscaping the North side of the Church. We had hoped that it would have been completed last fall. The landscapers now said it should be completed by May 15, 2022. Of course, this all depends on if the weather cooperates.

The Trustees decided that Salem needs a workday to clean up our flower beds/ shrub areas and to fill in the areas around the two air conditioners with gravel on the north and south sides of the building. The gravel will be there for that task. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Narthex for those willing to help. When you sign up you can choose weeding one of the several flower beds or placing gravel in one of the air conditioner areas. Dress for your task and bring whatever tool or tools you will need. This event will take place on Saturday JUNE 11th from 9AM to 12PM. When you are finished, you may leave. Donuts, juice, and water will be provided. Many hands will make quick work of these tasks.
