Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." Matthew 6:25; 33

As we make plans for the summer and the near future, I am sure many of you, just like me, are getting anxious for our personal financial situation as well as for the economy of our country. In case anyone needs a reminder: the cost of gas, food, energy and basic goods have been skyrocketing as the inflation is growing; average earnings have been dropping; 401K and funds have been going down.....Not a pretty picture. This happens periodically to the economy. Nevertheless, the memory of the 2018 crash is still very vivid and the fear of what may happen again is justifiable.

My mind is going to the words of Jesus in the Sermon of the Mountain: *Do not worry, but seek first God's Kingdom and all things will be given to you.*

First of all it is a reminder that I am not in charge, God is. My worrying only steals life and peace from me. He will take care of us. Fear is not going control my life. That doesn't mean we live in denial of reality and sweep everything under the rug. We are given the ability to make smart choices for ourselves and our loved ones which may include controlling our spending, our waste and the need for immediate gratification. It also includes simplifying and learning how to prioritize. This is actually an awesome way to make changes that need to be made anyway.

Second of all, it is the opportunity to use our resources for what is lasting and eternal, not just for things that are here now and will be gone soon. Of course we need to meet our everyday expenses and still do fun things. Nevertheless this summer we have the opportunity to seek first the Kingdom of God as we make our financial choices. And the key word here is GENEROSITY. A common mistake in time of financial anxiety is stopping or decreasing our giving. When we do that, we give in to anxiety and fear which only creates more fear and anxiety. Generosity instead is God's way, it is the way of love, the way of the Kingdom. Generosity leads us to live in God's economy where it is more blessed to give than receive, and in so doing, we actually receive surprisingly more than we could ever expect.

This summer I will "seek first the Kingdom". I am not giving in to fear, but instead I will live in God's economy. Among other things I will increase my weekly giving to Salem, opening myself to the surprising blessings God has in store for me! I hope you can join me.


The Trustees are not going to meet in July or August, but rest assured if a problem arises, we will take care of it.
