You open Your hand and *satisfy* the *desires* of every living thing.

Psalm 145:16

On August 15, one of the most influential theologians, writer and pastor of our time passed away at age 96. His name was Frederick Buechner. One of my favorite quotes by Buechner is: "*The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet*."

We were created to make a difference and have an impact over this world, yet often we are not sure how to understand what our call is and how we can make a difference. Buechner simply states where our calling can be found: it is the place where our joy and the greatest needs meet.

We are not supposed to hate what we do for God. That is not where God calls us to be and act. God gives us the desire and the passion to do what God needs us to do. The desire is the indicator of God's calling. Yet the desire alone can be misleading and can simply be our ego speaking. True calling is where our joy and our passion grows as we serve where the need is.

When we follow our calling we should not be feeling exhausted, unhappy, and out of place. When we follow our calling we should feel gladness, deep satisfaction, a sense of being useful as we make a difference in the world. Our deep gladness is what makes our work sustainable. The world's deep hunger is what makes our work meaningful.

This doesn't mean we will not experience failures, frustration, suffering, and discouragement. We will. Yet, God often uses our failures and frustrations so that we remain grounded in Him and keep our spirit humble. He uses our suffering and discouragement to raise our sense of empathy toward those who are suffering. That way we can speak hope in their life in ways that we would not be able to do if we didn't experience it ourselves.

I personally find a great gladness in serving God through my ministry at Salem. I am grateful to all of you who are part of this community. I am deeply blessed.

As we kick off a new church year please open your heart to hear God's calling to serve through Salem.

What is an area of deep gladness for you? What is a desire that God placed in your heart? Where is the place of deep hunger where God calls to act upon?

Please pray about this.
