Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations." Jeremiah 1:5

We are all wonderfully made and set apart so we can go into the world and make a difference. God gives us a life that counts. We are charged by God to go out and be fruitful.

I hope you all know that you were created to make a difference. Also, I hope you have the opportunity to share this truth with others, especially with those who are crushed by disappointment and failure and don't see any value in their life.

Now, how can we make our life count?

Jesus explained it well. Remember the parable He told us about the man who before leaving for a journey gives talents to his servants? (Matthew 25:14-30) One received 5 and went out and made 5 more, the second received 2, and went out and made two more. The last received one and for fear of losing it, he hid it in the ground. Do you remember what happened when the man comes back from his journey? He was pleased with the two servants who used the talents and multiplied them but he was deeply disappointed with the one who for fear of losing the talent put it in the ground.

We are people of faith, we live under God's economy, an economy of abundance.

Step up in faith this October. Make your life count. I know I will. I know you will.



During the holidays, Salem partners with Eras Senior Network and accepts donations of gift cards and stamps for seniors in our community. More information to come.






A heartfelt thank you to everyone who donated during Undie Sundays in September. There will be updates coming soon.



After a two-month recess in which needed parts were ordered and working conditions could be optimized, trustees and volunteers completed many "small" (but important) tasks to keep Salem running:

- Repaired overhead lights in youth room
- Installed base moldings in youth room
- Stored ladder, excess moldings, and spare light parts that had been temporarily stored in youth room
- Arranged for the use of narthex by Woods Edge Condo Assoc. for their annual meeting
- Replaced key pad on the east door
- Sealed limestone facade to prevent damage from sidewalk salt
- Sprayed weeds in the mulched planting beds
- Collected spare batteries for un anticipated malfunctions
- Eliminated wasp nests at our front door

These were in addition to now starting to prepare for winter heating season by repairing our boiler and maintaining the new HVAC units. Volunteers are also aiding trustees in arranging for filling of holes and smoothing the irregular surface in the north yard between Salem and NPSL.
