Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for God is at work in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure. Philippians 2:12-13

February 22nd is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lent journey that will end on Sunday, April 9th with the Easter celebration. My invitation to you all is to work on our spiritual growth this Lent. Some people believe spiritual growth is our job, our discipline, our commitment while others believe it is God's job, the work of his love and Grace

Whose job is spiritual growth?

It is actually a joint project between us and God.

Our spiritual growth is empowered by God; it's impossible without him. The sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit is powerful and mysterious. We can't control or manufacture it. It's not about us coming up with a program with predictable results we control. On the other hand, we're not passive. Our job is to discern where the wind of the Spirit is blowing and know how to catch it. It is like sailing. When I'm sailing I am utterly dependent on the wind. Without the wind I don't go anywhere. I don't have any control over the wind. Nevertheless, I'm not passive, I have a role to play - I hoist the sails and steer with the rudder. I have to catch the wind.

For this reason, Lent is a wonderful opportunity to take time to pay attention to the Wind, let the Wind work though us.

This Lent we will be sending a daily Lenten devotion email to you. Make room during the day to read it and reflect about it. Consider joining our Thursday night (6:30-7:30) ZOOM Bible Study. It is a wonderful group that studies the scripture and prays for each other. Participate in worship. This year the Lenten worship series is about the new life that comes out of grief and loss.

Take time to serve, be hospitable, open your heart to those in your life and in your community who are in need of your love, time, and care.

This is the part we play in our spiritual growth.

God's intent is to sanctify you so you can love as God loves.

And after service... It will be time to taste and judge delicious cookies from our secret bakers.





A Study of Loss and Grief from the Book of John

Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. John 12:24

We all suffer tremendous losses during our life. Can the pain of grief become a gift of new life overtime? Let us walk with Jesus this Lent through the book of John as we discover how God brings new life out of loss and grief. Every week we will start the message time with a personal short story of someone who experienced different kinds of loss and grief in their lives.

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"



Below are the ideas we shared:

How hospitable are we to members and visitors?

- Have greeters
- New members state they feel welcome
- Narthex well used for meeting/greeting/ eating
- Bathrooms great
- New Perspectives door
- Friendly people/not forced, sincere and real

What do we do well in hospitality?

- We are genuine
- Respect people's space
- Infrastructure in place
- Welcoming
- Try to follow up with visitors and pastor visits
- Information and good communication
- Welcoming spirit throughout worship
- People visit with all (sit at different tables, people sit if open chair)

How can we improve our hospitality in the following areas?

Building

- Signage: horizontal signs down the hall for restrooms, adult classrooms etc., in addition to signs on doors
- Bench in bathroom
- New garbage cans and locations
- Better lighting at all entrances
- Covered entrance at handicap accessible door
- Charging station
- Need more narthex space:

Solution:

- Remove the kiosk, perhaps use the triangular top
- Better utilize "Happenings Center." Large letters/banner above it, so people become aware of it...bigger sign
- Adult classroom: have basic supplies such as pens, paper and Bookends or bookshelf on counter for bibles etc.

Parking lot

- New stop sign and post at highway (old, bent, rusty, ugly)
- Salt is a problem for people with walkers
- Umbrella crew to welcome when you arrive in rain
- Canopy for front door, over parking lot
- Welcome flag at entrance of the parking lot

Landscaping

- Weeds in landscape and parking lot
- Refresh parking lot lines

Welcoming at the door

- Greeters need to be comfortable with interacting and even seeking info of new visitors
- Have a meeting for greeters
- Welcome station: something for kids?
- Wear your name tags each Sunday

Welcoming to all ages and to all needs

- Something fun for children in the narthex
- Helping people to know room locations (restrooms, child care/Sunday school, sanctuary)
- Personal tours

Marketing

- "Salem" pens
- Newspaper exposure: picture of Healing Hearts donation and activities
- Happenings Table: announce in email and bulletin, make it more visible

- Website action
- Utilize Message board in narthex with events and happenings
- Bigger sign at Happening Center

Mission Trip to Italy

Our mission trip to Italy will leave on June 30th and will return on July 14th. It is an intergenerational team with 5 youth.

For the mission part of the trip, we will be working with 50 children coming from low income families. The children attend the United Methodist center near Naples (https://www.casamianitti.com/) The center cares for children all year long. They feed them two meals and snacks every day, provide for clothing and other needs, supports them with school work and organizes activities and games for their entertainment.

Our intergenerational team of 15 will work daily with the children bringing special activities, games, music, and supply resources etc.

Our fundraising has the goal to decrease the overall cost of the trip and make it more affordable for our team to go.
