Yesterday I was reminded that twenty years ago Mister Rogers passed away. I remember watching him with my kids every afternoon after school. The show was not glamourous and colorful like the Disney movies, yet we were glued to the TV. I think the reason was that Mister Rogers created an intimate space filled with kindness and warm hospitality toward everyone. He was bringing a sense of calmness, peace, and love that is often lacking in our lives and in our world.

In 1997, Mister Rogers received a lifetime achievement award for his work in TV. And instead of a long speech he chose to use his time to invite the entire audience filled with famous actors, producers and directors to take some time in complete silence to think of the people who helped them to become who they are. Those who cared about them and wanted the best for their lives. In seconds, tears start flowing in the theater. Kindness and hospitality are contagious.

On the other hand, some days we get caught in negativity. We see the worst in the people around us and in the world where we live. That too is extremely contagious. Before we know it, the worst of us comes out in words, looks, thoughts... We become unkind and judgmental. Pain, struggles, worries and hurt tend to intensify our unkindness. We constantly fall in patterns we hate, hurting others and ourselves. We try to change and improve, but those changes last a very short time.

We cannot do it alone, but Jesus can, if we let him.

The Lord said:

"My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." 2 Corinthians 12:9 There is nothing we can do to make God love us more and there is nothing we can do to make God love us less. This is our saving Grace.

During this season of Lent, let's turn into God's hands all your negativity, malice, resentment, anger and ask Him to change our heart with His Grace. You will know it is working when you start seeing people around you the way God does.

WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT MUJILA FALLS?

The Mujila Falls Agriculture Center was started in 1995 by Paul and Roxanne Webster, in Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and was dedicated to helping the Lunda tribe move from a hunter-gatherer existence to one of permanent, sustainable, commercial agriculture. Over-hunted, the land couldn't support the growing population. There was also a need for income to support families, buy medicines, and send children to school. Due to poor diets, the Lunda people had a 50% infant mortality rate and life expectancy



of less than 35 years. Civil conflict in the Congo caused the relocation of personnel to Zambia and the reconstruction of a food security ministry at Mujila Falls with 250 acres of land donated by Christian Chief Kanyama of the Lunda people. The chief's condition was that the center would teach basic sound agricultural principles to the residents of his chiefdom.



Since Paul Webster retired, the agriculturist at Mujila Falls is Temba Nkomozepi, a remarkable young man with the mission statement "to help people help themselves with dignity." Temba takes part in a range of agricultural, education, and health projects, as well as church growth Mujila Falls raises essential crops, such as corn, and engages in small animal husbandry, cattle and goat milking, fruit culture, tree nurseries, fish culture, and research. In 2020, Salem helped fulfill Temba's dream of a small dormitory for high school and college students who visit the Center, as well as Peace Corps volunteers who are helped to get a feel of their future work in Africa.

The dorm has been called "Salem House" in honor of our support for so many years! Watch your bulletin insert to see what project we will help Temba with this year!

On Palm Sunday we will have our annual pie fundraiser for Mujila Falls. We are hoping to have a video chat with Temba at that time too.





Please Pray for our Mission Trip to Italy



Our mission trip to Italy will leave on June 30th and will return on July 14th. It is an intergenerational team with 5 youth.

For the mission part of the trip, we will be working with 50 children coming from low income families. The children attend the United Methodist center near Naples (https://www.casamianitti.com/) The center cares for children all year long. They feed them two meals and snacks every day, provide for clothing and other needs, supports them with school work and organizes activities and games for their entertainment.

Our intergenerational team of 15 will work daily with the children bringing special activities, games, music, and supply resources etc.
