Hadfield Elementary School Outreach Update



Salem is pleased to partner with Hadfield Elementary School to help meet the needs of low -income children in our community. With our Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation grant we have been able to continue to supply daily snacks for those children who do not have any.

Since September 1,534 snacks have been delivered. To the school's clothes closet we supplied 15 pairs if waterproof gloves so those without gloves could enjoy Wisconsin winters. The school health room was in need of clothing for emergency situations, and we sent 15 pair of athletic pants along with 24 pair of underwear.

For children who were having trouble swallowing medications, we supplied cups of applesauce to help the medicine go down. We will be addressing other needs as they arise and hope that these small gestures make the day easier for both students and staff.

You Don't Know What War Is


An eyewitness account of the war in Ukraine by a 13-year-old girl.

On Pluto


A book about Living, not dying with Alzheimer's **Bus to Corinth**
