Forgive doesn't mean forget. It means to choose the way of love over the way of hate.



As you know we were targeted by phishing. Pastor Paola's name has been used for fake phone texts and fake emails to most of the church members asking to buy gift cards and for favors. This action of exploiting the trust the church has for their Pastor for financial gain is just awful. Other churches and even bishops have also been targeted. We are changing all passwords and taking safety steps.

Nevertheless, what really works is education and awareness. Here are the steps we all need to take.

Clues to pay attention to:

- Pastor Paola would never ever ask for money, purchases or favors with a text or personal email. Our fundraising always comes by office snail mail and church announcement. If I need a favor, I'll call in person.
- The language is off and unusual.
- · Requests are off and unusual.
- Notice the phone number and email address and compare to what you have.

What to do:

- Don't ever reply to suspicious texts or emails.
- If in doubt, ask Pastor Paola or the Office
- Send scam email to Junk and block it.
- Block phone number of a fake text and report it.
- Inform the church office if it happens to you.
