Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

Jesus said: Freely you have received; freely give. Matthew 10:8b

When my kids were little, I would constantly be telling them after receiving anything: What should you say to...? I am sure you did the same. So they would automatically say "Thank you". Most of the time they wouldn't even be aware of what they would say, nevertheless it was a first step in the process of learning gratitude.

Then one day, years later, something great happened: my kids started telling me how they went out of their way to help others, to bring a meal, to care for someone sick, to help someone...

That day I felt my soul filled with pride. That day they entered into the circle of gratitude by learning one of the greatest truths: Love doesn't charge, it is given freely.

This is a revolutionary idea that Jesus brought into the world. Just like hope, forgiveness and humility. They have become desired and honorable virtues through Jesus who supremely manifested them on the cross. Before Jesus they were not virtues, they were actually considered a flaw, a characteristic of the losers.

The same is for gratitude. At Jesus's time everything was based on obligation: somebody who had more would give a gift to someone in need. The receiver from that moment on, was obligated toward the giver. The gift always came with strings attached. The receiver would need to give back service, praise, and honor to the benefactor. So that the power of the benefactor would keep growing.

Jesus turns the idea of gratitude around. God is the giver of all, God is concerned about everyone particularly of the poor, the sick, the desperate and the lonely. God made us in His image and the best way to show gratitude to God is to care for those who suffer and are in need. So that the circle of generosity keeps on growing. God gives freely to us, we give freely to others creating more generosity. When I give freely, Jesus is present. This is the plan of creation: a growing project of generosity.

I would like to invite you all during this Thanksgiving season to show your gratitude to God by freely giving as freely as you received. I believe God's heart as a good Father, will be filled with pride as you fully enter into the growing circle of gratitude.






Special Thanksgiving Eve Service at Salem




