Koinonia

We are blessed. What we have is what the scripture calls *koinonia* a Greek word often translated as fellowship. Koinonia happens when we share life together, especially spiritual life. Koinonia is when something happens to you and people pray for you, send you cards, provide food, call you, and help you. Koinonia is about worshiping and serving together to bless many others.

Of course, we can pray alone, and we can be in the presence of God alone but we cannot grow spiritually or heal alone we need each other. We need each other prayers, encouragement, generosity, and challenge. Jesus himself needed a community in order to spread His love.

The presence of God is much more powerful when we are together. Koinonia changes the world one connection at a time.




New Perspectives has a concern about people driving **TOO FAST** in the back parking lot that connects to Salem. We ask that you please **SLOW DOWN**.
