
# Salem United Methodist Church June/July 2024



## Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

"Why were you searching for Me?" Jesus asked his parents.
"Didn't you know that I had to be in My Father's house? Luke 2:49

This is what preteen Jesus said to his worried sick parents who had been looking for him for days and they finally found him in the temple. Even though it is Jesus speaking, I can't help but hear in his words a teenager's attitude very familiar to all parents.

Nevertheless, Jesus was also explaining to them something about his identity: He was at home with the Father and the temple was the physical place where he belonged.

This is what church is about, the physical place where we can be at home with God. Of course, there are many other places where we feel at home with the Father, (in our hearts, in nature, with people we love...). Nevertheless, when we are at church something special happens: together we become the body of Christ, different people with different views of the world, different journeys, and different social backgrounds united in Christ. Our differences are not something we have to deal with and endure. Our differences are actually where we find God. This is the explosive Good News of Pentecost, God's dream for humanity: a community where everyone is accepted and welcome, where differences are a gift, and where everyone feels safe. This can become a challenge at times as we all have a natural attraction toward people like us and a fear of diversity. As challenging as that may be at times, remember it is in the differences that we find God. We have a calling to make Salem a place where everyone can experience the Father's house.

We come together in fellowship, prayer, worship, celebration, service, generosity, and spiritual growth. We rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. (Romans 12:15).

I am sure in your own family, among friends and neighbors there are people who have a hunger for love, God and community but they are not sure where to find it. Invite them to come to worship with you.

They may find at Salem the Home they have been yearning for.

As you can read in this Tidings, Salem is not closing for summer. We will have a summer filled with new worship series, mission, outreach, and opportunities for service and fellowship.

### **Hadfield School Snack Collection and Grant Expenditures**



**Thank you**, Salem for your continued support of our snack collection for Hadfield Elementary School. Another 136 snacks were delivered to Hadfield School, making our **total donation 2,573** for the 2023-2024 school year.

We will be suspending the snack collection for the summer months.

We had \$1,665 from the 2024 WUMF grant available for Hadfield School. After speaking with them, the Outreach team decided to purchase requested school supplies for 25 classrooms for fall. They were delivered in May, as they were excited to receive them now. We will contact them in late summer for any other supplies that they may need. We have \$1,050.91 remaining from the grant which must be spent before the end of December. When the delivery was made, Hadfield said it was like "Christmas in July" except of course, it was May. They expressed their gratitude to Salem for all we have done.

### Outreach Pie Sale on August 4th - Temba & Mujila Falls



For over 40 years Salem has shown support for Mujila Falls Agriculture Center in Zambia, Africa. Every year we have committed to provide money for our missionary's salary as do numerous other churches in WI and the mid-west. We also have had yearly fund-raisers to help with anything necessary to continue the purpose of Mujila Falls which is, to put it briefly, "To help people help themselves with dignity." The Center creates employment opportunities, contributes to rural development, has started a primary school and is establishing a vocational college

among a myriad of other things. Through the years, Salem has contributed money for many diverse projects including money for concrete to build a chicken house, baby chicks, chicken feed, power tools, and tilapia for new fish ponds. Several years ago, we raised enough money for a dormitory to be built which houses visitors to the Center including Peace Corps workers who get an introduction to life in Africa, and students desiring to have a future in agriculture. We were so honored when Temba announced I the dorm would be called Salem House I. Once the dorm was built, we provided funds to furnish it; hads, tables



called Salem House! Once the dorm was built, we provided funds to furnish it; beds, tables, chairs, sofas, etc. Last year we donated money for the start of an orchard around the dorm. The primary school started



last year with a first grade of 50 students with some children having to be turned away. That is why this year another classroom will be started and needs to be furnished. Ideally, if enough funds are raised, a new well can be dug for the school also. So, as we start thinking about "Back to School", remember the Outreach Pie Sale on Aug. 4<sup>th</sup>! Let's help the students at Mujila Falls have a positive learning experience in a completely furnished classroom!

Jim Seegers for getting and spreading dirt for the landscaping project. This saved the church a lot of money.


Jim Seegers, Caryn Adair, & Rob Roszkoski for laying netting for the new grass that was planted on the sides.
