Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

A friend of mine called me this morning and announced: *It is spring! Yeah! It actually happening!* I wanted to believe her so bad...

To be truthful it doesn't feel like Spring nor does it look like Spring, but Spring is here. While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease.

Pet program's "Paw-sitive" Impact




Waukesha's food pantry began their pet program in 2023, after a client asked for pet food. The client was worried about having to surrender her dog because she couldn't afford her own food, let alone food for her pet.

Many clients face difficult choices while going through tough times, and it is important to try to ensure that the pets stay with their families! This alerted the food pantry of the need to start a pet program to prevent four-legged family members from being surrendered.

Although the food pantry's primary mission is "people" food, they recognize how beneficial a pet food distribution program is, so that all the members of a client's household have access to food. With this in mind, we will have a **Youth Sponsored Pet Food Drive** beginning on April 27th and ending on May 11th. Dog food, cat food, toys, and treats are all welcome! 

Happy to report that all toilets are now functional and open for use with the exception of the bathroom by the kitchen. Research is being done to better understand the sewer lateral system to determine future needs.

The bell tower cross is on hold due to the discovery of significant rot found in the bell tower structure.

Insurance concerns have been addressed with a new insurance carrier, more to follow.

Security cameras have been proposed for the doors and parking lot, this is an approved project and will move forward.

As a result of the high winds, a portion of the roof on the outside shed blew off. This was addressed and the roof was successfully repaired.

For the next two years we will be in the midst of the Highway 59 pavement replacement project. Generally, the Salem entrance on 59 will remain open except for a few week days when actual construction is in the immediate area. Plans call for rebuilding our driveway in stages so that there will always be a way in or out, even though the highway is being excavated.

Notice that, except for winter shut down and a short period on either end of the project, traffic on Highway 59 will be limited to one lane in each direction.

This may make turning into or out of the Salem entrance on 59 very uncomfortable in morning and afternoon weekday traffic peaks; not to mention the forest of orange barrels.

The entrance to New Perspectives, Salem auxiliary access, will remain open for Salem use. This may provide some anxiety relief due to less and slower traffic, along with signals at the intersection of 59 and Broadway.
