The contract for the two year project on Hwy 59 (\$24,000,000) has been awarded and is waiting for acceptance by the contractor.

However, the New Perspectives (Salem auxiliary) entrance will remain open, offering a less congested alternative with traffic signals at 59 and Broadway for smoother access.

Sophie's Garden


