


# Salem UMC September 2025

## Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them.



With these words, Jesus revolutionized the way the society thought and treated children. In the ancient world, children's mortality was very high. 50% of children died before 5 from illness and malnutrition. For that reason, they were not even considered part of the community. They were also considered incomplete human beings because they were dependent on adults and didn't have the ability to contribute. They were often sold into slavery for little money.

Jesus changed all by welcoming the children in His community. He firmly scolded anyone who excluded them. He even lifted up the children as a model for our faith and life in the kingdom of God. Because of Jesus, children became part of the society. The first Christians started to care for the poor and abandoned children, and eventually created orphanages and homes for them.

Today, children have a primary place in the family and in society; in many cases, they have even become the main center of attention, creating a new set of concerns. Nevertheless, we don't often remember that Jesus said the children belong to the kingdom of God, and because of their trustworthy nature, they are a model of faith for us. Plus...They are so much fun!! Children's time is often my favorite time in the service. I never know what is going to happen...I love that they keep me on my toes.

Our children need to be active and visible at Salem. We need to hear their voices and their dreams if we want to grow in faith as a community together. Contrary to common belief, they are the church of today and not only the church of tomorrow. Salem has a lot to give to the children.

At church, they can learn

- That they are deeply loved by God
- How to serve and use their gifts
- That they are surrounded by a safe and caring intergenerational community, something extremely rare in today's society.

I am well aware that families are much busier than they were in the past. Children's sport organizations now schedule practices and games on Sunday. Nevertheless, we cannot give up. We need to face the new challenges and figure out ways to provide Christian education and spiritual and service opportunities to our children. In this Tidings, you will read about some of the changes that are going to take place this year. I count on you all. Pray for our children, listen to them, volunteer to help in children events, and learn from them.

# Hope Center Meal Volunteer Opportunity

Friday, September 26th 5:00 - 7:00 pm

Salem will be serving the evening meal at the **Hope Center** on **Friday, September 26, 2025.** The Hope Center is located at 101 W. Broadway in Waukesha and serves needy residents of Waukesha County.

There are two ways you can be a part of this outreach to the hungry in our community.

#### 1. We will need 5-7 servers.

Servers will arrive at 5:00 pm to help serve beverages. At 5:30 they will serve the meal and desserts.

Afterwards they will help with the cleanup by washing tables and sweeping the floor. (Children under age 10 can volunteer as long as there are at least 2 adults for every child.)

Clean-up is usually completed by 6:30.

### 2. We will also supply milk and desserts:

10 gallons of milk Cookies or bars for 80-90 people (These could be homemade or store bought.) *Food items should arrive at the Hope Center by 5:00 on September 20th* 

Look for the sign up at the Happenings Center if you can help as a server or provide milk or cookies. **Thank you.**

Our knitting ministry is starting up again for the fall. We make prayer shawls that are delivered to people who are sick or lonely.


We also donate knitted items for those in need in our community.

### Something new has been added!


In addition to donating all kinds of books, complete puzzles, CD's and DVD's, you may donate games to our book sale. Bring any of these items to church
