He could see beauty and wonder in every moment and circumstance, which led him to live a very joyful life.

Would you like to have this kind of joy in your life? I would!!

I would like to invite you this month to make room in your life, in your mind, and soul for gratitude. Take it as a challenge if it helps you. If you are like me, you need a discipline of gratitude; otherwise, there will always be something else to do and think about. We are pretty good at thanking people for doing or giving us something. Let's start the day by thanking the One who gave us the gift of life; look around your house, smell your coffee, and have your breakfast with a grateful heart.

Our mind is a garden, and gratitude must be cultivated; otherwise, it will not happen naturally.

I believe gratitude has never been needed more than these days, filled with hatred, unkindness, polarization, and uncertainty. Gratitude is at the absolute core of the human soul and can save us from falling into the deep end. Gratitude is not optional.


