be strong and take heart

and wait for the LORD. Psalm 27:14



I remember when my kids were little, they could not wait for this time of the year to take our nativity out the box and set it out on a special table. We had a tradition though: we left the manger empty until Christmas Eve. Every year, I would explain to the kids that we needed to wait for Christmas to put the baby Jesus in the manger. Yet every day through Advent, they would ask me: "Can we put Jesus in the manger today? Is it time yet?". Waiting was never their strongest suit. Waiting is really not my strongest suit either. Actually, I don't know anyone who loves waiting.

We struggle deeply with impulsivity. We don't want to have to wait. We hate to wait because when we wait we are not in control. One of my least favorite waiting times is when I am on a plane and it is delayed. And here comes the pilot: "We are doing all we can to take off. I want to thank you for your patience". How does the pilot know that I was being patient? I may not be patient at all.

The message of Advent is about waiting for Jesus to come. Yet our waiting is not to be boring, but it is time to be expectant. It is about anticipation and excitement. It is a time to make room for Jesus in our lives. It is about waiting for the Lord.

The prophets of the Old Testament and the psalmists were waiting. Mary is waiting; Joseph is waiting. Elisabeth, Zachariah, the Wise men, Simeon and Anna, and John the Baptist are waiting for the coming of the Lord.

Please join me this Advent at Salem every Sunday as we wait for the Lord to come and bring to our lives the gifts that we yearn for the most, gifts that cannot be bought: hope, love, joy, and peace. And as we wait, we change and make space in our hearts for the Lord to come.

These Tidings are filled with opportunities of service, ministry, and celebration for this Advent season.



November's focus was cleaning up a couple projects...


- Buckthorn eradication effort continues,
 Thanks to Dave Pauly, Jim Seegers and Jeff Seeboth we have cleared another 50
 yards south along the east property line. The
 long-term plan will include planting of
 decorative bushes and grasses in the spring
- The security system door bell camera is working perfectly, however the bell itself needs an interface module to connect to the bell inside of the building, they are on back order and Kari Schmidt is following up.
- The exterior light above the east entrance door was rewired for temporary use, a new light was voted on and approved for a replace fixture. Thank you Jim Seegers for installing it.
- The building's heating system required extra attention this month. Thanks to help from Jim Seegers, Jeff Seeboth, and Doug McGrath by phone, the system has been sorted out. This highlighted a gap in our knowledge, so we will be creating a full tutorial—with photos—to ensure anyone can operate the system confidently in the future.
